Lucio C. Tosato, 90, of Manlius passed away Monday, March 3, 2014. Born in Verona, Italy before the war the family moved to the colony of Libia in Africa to farm. Soon after he was drafted by the Italian Army during WWII. His company was captured and he was a POW for 3 ½ years in Africa. After the war, he returned to Italy where he attended a school for Tailoring and opened a small tailor shop. In 1967 he decided to move the family to USA after getting a job at Zells as a tailor at the Hotel Syracuse. Four years later he got a job at USMC base at Quantico, VA where he worked 15 years and during that time he became a proud US citizen in 1974. The family moved back to Syracuse in 1992. He and Dalmina were communicants of St. Ann's Church, Manlius . He was predeceased by his two brothers Nello and Duilio. Lucio is survived by his wife of 66 years Dalmina (Brognara) Tosato; sons, Claudio (Debbie) of Onondaga Hill and Luciano of Manlius; two brothers Mario and Bruno both of Cantalupo Milan, Italy; seven grandchildren, many great grandchildren and one great grandchild.
