Believe me I was a pretty annoying showoff kid. Always craving attention. Talking to much. I learned as I grew up to be like Bob. Bob had way more friends than me. Because he had integrity. Honesty. And respected people as much as all of the creatures on this planet. Alas he was taken to young. I don't believe in heaven or God. But I wish I did. So I could see Bob, my Sister Sandy, Mounds, and Joe O'Neil in heaven. (BTW Bob had to tell Joe's parents he drowned in NC. Cause they were like brothers.)

I see there isn't going to be any funeral services but I think we should all gather at our favorite watering hole in Lakeland Wally's Bellvedere to have a get together to share our stories of our adventures with one of the greatest friends I ever had the pleasure of knowing.
