Arthur D. Darrow, 81 of Camillus and Fort Pierce, FL died January 16th at St. Lucie Hospice House in Fort Pierce, FL after a courageous battle against throat and tongue cancer for almost a year. Art was born in Syracuse and made his home in the area his whole life. He was a winter resident of Road Runner Travel Resort. Art was an Army veteran of WWII, serving from 1946 to 1948 during the occupation of Japan. He drove tractor trailer for 28 years as a member of the Teamsters Local 317 in Syracuse.
