May 31, 1950 - May 18, 2026

Bart T. Cutler, 75, of Geddes, passed away Monday, May 18, surrounded by family and friends at Iroquois Nursing Home. Born in Syracuse, Bart attended Westhill High School before proudly serving in the U.S. Army. He was a highly decorated Vietnam War veteran and remained deeply proud of his military service throughout his life.

Bart was a charter member of W.A.V.E.S. Ambulance and dedicated much of his time to volunteer service within the community. His many contributions included volunteering with DAV, Meals on Wheels, Cornell Cooperative Extension Tree Steward program, CNY Bike Giveaway, and the Onondaga Creek Cleanup.

Following his return from military service, Bart worked for many years as an independent contractor, helping countless families throughout the area. He was also well known for his more than 22 years working in the hardware department at Sears, Roebuck and Co. in Fairmount. He was predeceased by his parents, a sister, and daughter.

Bart is survived by his two children, five grandchildren, two brothers, two sisters, and many close friends.

Calling hours will be held Thursday, May 21, from 4 to 6 p.m. at B.L. Bush & Sons Funeral Home, with services to follow at 6 p.m. Burial with military

honors will be held at a later date at Onondaga County Veterans Memorial Cemetery.
