Dr. Raymond W. Vreeland, 84, of Skaneateles died Friday while at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston. Born in Syracuse, he graduated from Union Springs Academy, served in the Army following graduation and later went to University of Pittsburgh Dental School. He practiced dentistry in his own practice for over 46 years in Jamesville and later in Syracuse offices. He was a member of the Onondaga County Dental Society, 5th District Study Club and Westvale Seventh Day Adventist Church. “ *CELEBRATION of the Life of Raymond W. Vreeland, DDS By: S.W. Vreeland Burbank, California July 23, 2010 It is a difficult task to sum up the life of another man in a few words. It is impossible to access the life stature of a brother so very close although for a significant number of years we lived thousands of miles apart. On the other hand, with the aid of the telephone and internet, we intimately shared our thoughts and hearts. My Brother, “Bill” as we in the family called him, was my protector and guide when we were “kids.” He was my hero when I was a child and a mentor throughout the later years. For the first few years, three of “us boys,” shared the same crowded bedroom in that little house in Fairmount, NY. Bill and I shared the same bed. On cold winter nights when frost would form on the windows and walls, I could snuggle up close to “Bill” to keep warm. He was my “Big Brother,” and to me then, and, it will always be so. In the late 1930”s we moved to our Grandmother’s farm. For me it was a big adventure. She was alone and had a big farm to run. So we were there to “help out.” Bill was fooling around with me in the kitchen one day when my head hit the edge of the sink and severely cutting the bridge of my nose. Oh, how concerned for his little brother he was. Infection set in but I survived. For many years I carried the scar and Bill frequently would examine it. In the summer time, I saw Bill drive the hay wagon with a two horse team. One of the horses name was, “Duke.” As he stood on the load of hay, Bill’s head appeared to reach to the sky! Wow! That big load of hay had to be loaded into the barn. Again, my hero hooked up “Fanny,” a dappled gray yearling, to the hay fork that would lift large forks of hay off the wagon and into the barn. Folks, for me, that was an adventure! In 1941, we moved back to the little house in Fairmount. In the summer time, little brother, “Gene” and I would go swimming and bathing in the near-by Geddes Brook. We thought we were alone, but were unaware of the watchful eye of “Big Brother Bill.” He did not always make his presence known to us. He was concerned about the safety of his two little brothers. There lived a bully or two in the area that sometimes abused his little brothers. Bill was there to make sure they could swim and play unmolested. In later years we found pictures that “Bill” had taken of his brothers*

*at that swimming hole. I treasure those pictures now. After returning from "the farm" Bill and Sister Marie went to the Fairmount Schools. The first one was called "The Old School," which later became the Fairmount Fire Department. When Mom would send him off to school, among her last words to him would be, "Get 100." And he did. Bill became a diligent student. About 1935, the "New School," was completed, from which Bill graduated from the eighth grade. Again "my hero," showed up as the tallest one in the class! The graduation picture shows it. He then went to Solvay High School. Bill began to play the clarinet. He was very faithful in practicing. In his attempt to get real music amid the squeaks, it must have drove his mother nuts, but I never heard her complain. There is something about the young in learning music that instills tenacity about learning anything. It requires repetition until they get it right. I think that A large portion of Bill's success can be attributed to repetition as is with most any learning. During the middle 1940's our Dad, Mom and three boys joined the Seventh-Day Adventist Church in Syracuse. It was decided that "Bill," would go to Union Springs Academy to finish high school education. What an adventure for him! He made new friends for life there. After graduating from Union Springs Academy, he worked for the Specter Cadillac Dealership in Syracuse. Then to the US Army Air Force for two years. Bill had a great se*
