Gabriel Nagy 96, of Solvay died Thursday following a brief illness. He was born in Hungary and emigrated to Camillus with his family at the age of three. He worked for Camillus Cutlery for 50 years retiring in 1972. A member of the First English Lutheran Church in Syracuse and former church school teacher, frequent usher, men's bowling team and choir member. He was an avid fisherman until a few years ago. He was also a former member of the Liederkrantz Society in Syracuse.
