Gerd H. Grieshaber, 83, of Port St. Lucie, FL and formerly of Camillus, passed away on Tuesday at his daughter's home in Camillus. Born to Henry R. and Elise (Vedder) Grieshaber in Solingen, Germany, he emigrated to Camillus at age three. He graduated from Camillus High School and Auburn Community College. He retired from General Electric in 1975 after 29 years. He also worked for the Purchasing Dept for Onondaga County until 1982, when he and his wife retired to Port St. Lucie, FL. He was a 50 year member of the F&AM in Camillus Sapphire Lodge 786 then Morning Star Lodge 524, Camillus Historical Society, and past president of the Camillus Lions Club, as well as the Polish American Club and German American Club, both of Port St. Lucie. He was a four-term First Ward Councilman for the Town of Camillus and was very involved in community affairs. He enjoyed playing trumpet beside his wife, an accordianist, Amy, as well as folk dancing. He was predeceased by a brother Henry and sister Helga Dueltgen. Survivors are his wife of 58 years Amelia "Amy" (Masarek); two daughters, Nancy (Vars) Smith of Camillus and Kathy (Scott) Nichols of Pennellville; a son Gary (Carla) Grieshaber of East Syracuse; a brother, Gunther (Betty) Grieshaber of Camillus; and five grandchildren, Carla Engelbrecht, Steve Engelbrecht, Amie Nichols, Emily Nichols, and Colleen Grieshaber.
