Harry Nelson Teachout was born in Weedsport, NY on March 31st, 1919. He was the youngest of eight children to parents Sarah and Jerome Teachout. Harry left his family at age 13 to join a work camp. His strength and independence continued throughout his life time. He enlisted in the Army in the 401st Infantry on October 6, 1942. He served as a Private First Class and participated in the Invasion of France at Normandy. He was also awarded a Bronze star, Good Conduct Medal and the Purple Heart. He was seriously wounded in action June 19, 1944 and spent more than a year in a hospital in Danville, KY until his honorable discharge February 27, 1945. Harry loved his occupation as a Truck Driver but his true passions were as a motorcyclist and "Square" and 'Ballroom' Dancer. He won countless trophies and his friends proudly proclaim, "Harry was the Best that ever was." Harry has shared a very close friendship with so many including his partner, JoAnn Hanson whom he has known for 22 years and shared a home with for the past many years in San Diego. Harry is survived by his daughter Phyllis Makley of Camillus and a grandson Harold Makley of E. Syracuse.
