“ Hello to Lou's Family. The first and only time I met Lou was while attending a summer school class in Algebra @ West Genesee High School during summer of ninth grade. I didn't know anyone there as I went to Bishop Ludden, so it was a very scary proposition for me to go there. Lou sat right behind me in class. (She didn't want to be there either!) She was friendly and funny, had a warm laugh and a kind nature – not that "kind nature" was in my vocabulary back then, but she did – and she just made it an (obviously) memorable and pleasant experience for me to be in such unfamiliar surroundings! That was my only connection with Lou (then Snyder) – six weeks of summer school 39 years ago. Fast forward to yesterday: Thursday, October 12th. I was in CAM's pizza parlor - on Kasson Road in Camillus. I usually work in Syracuse, but had an appointment out of the office that day and had occasion to grab a slice @ CAM'S. It's a brand new place and I had never been there previously. I was the only customer in the place. It was about 3:00 p.m. There was a woman working the counter – not a "spring chicken" (a/k/a my age – 55). She had "dirty blonde" hair and quite the bubbly personality. As I sat eating my pizza, I was trying to think of who she reminded me of – and it hit me: Lou Snyder! After summer school that year, yesterday was the only time I had occasion to think of Lou after all these years. I smiled with fondness. Now today, Friday the 13th of October, I'm doing my daily (gruesome) perusal of the obituaries, noticed Lou's (mainly cuz of her age being my age) – not knowing it was "my" Summer School Lou, especially since it didn't say she attended West Genesee or the like – then I read the survivors' surname: "Snyder" and could not BELIEVE it – considering my memory from just the day before. I was shocked and saddened. I'm sorry to have taken you all through this snakelike story, but I am hoping that by doing so (and believing in God as I do), I like to think that while I was sitting in CAM's, Lou was taking one last "fly over" her old stomping grounds – West Genesee High, etc. – before going up to meet her Maker. I hope this story gives you a bit of levity with which to cope with your huge loss. My condolences to you all.
