Lucille Garlock, 98, of Skaneateles passed away Friday. Born in Utica, Lucille called Skaneateles home for over 60 years. She loved the lake and enjoyed gardening and her "pony". Trained as a harpist by Grace Weymer Follet, Lucille won the NYS competition for the harp while a student at Nottingham High School. She was an active member and former president of the CNY Harp Association. Lucille was also member of Order of the Eastern Star and former member of the United Methodist Church of Skaneateles. She retired from her position in the purchasing department with Onondaga County in 1974. She was predeceased by her loving husband, Carl Garlock in 1989.

She is survived by her son Drew (Lois) Silvieux of Cygnet, OH; a grandson David Silvieux; a granddaughter Cheryl Silvieux of Mesa, AZ; her niece and nephew Robin and John Jones of The Villages, FL, Jr; great grandchildren Gabreile and "DJ", great niece and nephew Tiffany and Christopher Jones; and many wonderful neighbors.

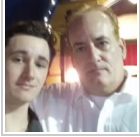
