



## Nancy (Whitney) Carroll

Nancy Carroll 60, of Bedford, TX and formerly of Syracuse died Monday at Harris Methodist Hospital in Fort Worth, Texas after a brief illness. Born in Rochester, she grew up in Phelps, NY before attending Syracuse University. She was employed by American Airlines where she worked for 29 years until her retirement in 2002. Her career began in Syracuse then Boston, Tulsa and finally Dallas. As a Trainer and Business Analyst she traveled internationally for the company. She was predeceased by her father Rev. Eli Whitney in February.
