Robert Farrar Conley, 82, of Camillus and Naples, FL and formerly of Marco Island, FL passed away Friday. Bob retired as a CPCU from Amica Mutual Insurance Co. after 39 years and served as a Regional Vice President. Bob was a former Adjunct Professor at LeMoyne College and active with the Brown University Alumni Regional Admissions. He was a member and past president of Claim Manager Council of Syracuse, a vestry member and past senior warden of St. Luke's Episcopal Church, past Chairman of Diocesan Convention Committee, founding member of Camillus Youth Hockey, summer driver for Echo Meals on Wheels, and volunteer for the Onondaga Health Department.
