Robert Kenyon Johns, 86, of Boone, NC and formerly of Skaneateles, died Saturday, September 25, 2004, at Mountain Home, V. A. Medical Center in Johnson City, Tennessee, after a lengthy illness. He was born June 27, 1918, in Centerville, NY, to the late Alfred and Mary Louise Kenyon Johns. Mr. Johns taught English at Skaneateles High School for 17 years. He was an active member and former president of both the Skaneateles Teachers Association and Onondaga County Teachers Association and served as president of the Onondaga Federal Credit Union, which he helped found. A graduate of Buffalo State Teachers College, he was named Distinguished Alumnus in 1971. He earned his masters degree from Syracuse University. After retiring to Tennessee, he wrote "A History, First Presbyterian Church, Elizabethton, Tennessee". Survivors include his wife of 53 years, Lois (Larkin) Johns, of the home, originally from Syracuse; three daughters, Penelope Johns of Redondo Beach, California; Pamela Vavra of Fayetteville, NC and Priscilla Johns of Valle Crucis, NC, and three grandchildren, Kenyon Hall, Justin Hall, and Grant Vavra.
