William E. "Bill" Barzee, Jr., 89, of Lakeland passed away on Sept. 28, 2024 at St. Joseph's Hospital after a short illness. Born in Syracuse to William and Jennie (Dashuk) Barzee, Sr. on January 10, 1935.

Bill joined P&C Foods in 1954 at the age of 17 and worked in warehouse operations his entire career, when they marked his 45th year of continuous service - a period where he only missed six days of work total - with a round of golf. They were surprised by his golf skills and how he found time to hit a few golf balls over the year. His family remembers him spending more time finding golf balls on the course than hitting them! And they have buckets to prove it.

He was predeceased by his wife Stacia (Rydelek) Barzee in 2017 and their son Robert E. Barzee in 2019.

Survived by a son, William "Bill" (Tammy) Barzee, III of Lakeland; daughter Lori (Teddy) Knafelc; several grandchildren and great-grandchildren: and two brothers Charles T.E. Barzee and Thomas E. Barzee.
