Born in Syracuse, Bill worked for 39 years at Carrier Corporation, retiring in 1981. Bill served in the U.S. Navy during WWII in the Pacific as Machinist Mate 1st Class on the carrier USS Langley CVL-27. He loved boating with family and friends, and ultimately he and Theda cruised down the inland waterway to Florida, where they lived on their boat for the first 2 years after they retired.
